Making a Limerick - Worksheet

Instructions:

- 1. Choose a topic for your limerick. This can be anything that you find interesting or funny.
- 2. Write down a list of words or phrases that relate to your topic. These can be nouns, adjectives, or verbs that describe your topic or add to the humor of your limerick.
- 3. Arrange your words and phrases into a five-line pattern. The first, second, and fifth lines should rhyme with each other, and the third and fourth lines should rhyme with each other.
- 4. Write your limerick using the pattern you have chosen. Be sure to use a catchy rhythm and clever wordplay to make it funny and memorable.
- 5. Revise and edit your limerick until you are happy with it. Make sure it flows well and has good pacing.

The purpose of the worksheet is to provide some prompts and guidance for creating a limerick, but it's up to the person creating the limerick to decide which words to use and how to incorporate them into the limerick. So, while the words/phrases and rhyming words columns may contain more words than are needed for a single limerick, they provide options for the writer to choose from and inspire creativity.
